Independent Auditor's Report

We have examined the accompanying Forms MS-965 With Adjustments for the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund of the Township of Jordan, Clearfield County, for the period January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2024. The municipality's management is responsible for presenting the Forms MS-965 in accordance with the criteria described in the Background section of this report and the Department of Transportation's *Publication 9*. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the Forms MS-965 With Adjustments based on our examination.

Our examination was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the standards applicable to attestation engagements contained in *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the examination to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Forms MS-965 are presented in accordance with the criteria described above, in all material respects. An examination involves performing procedures to obtain evidence about the Forms MS-965. The nature, timing, and extent of the procedures selected depend on our judgement, including an assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the Forms MS-965, whether due to fraud or error. We believe that the evidence we obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a reasonable basis for our opinion.

We are required to be independent and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with ethical requirements relating to the engagement.

As described in the Auditor Description of Select Transactions section of this report, the adjustments included on the Forms MS-965 With Adjustments are made by the Department of the Auditor General.

<u>Independent Auditor's Report (Continued)</u>

In our opinion, the Forms MS-965 With Adjustments present, in all material respects, the information required by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund of the Township of Jordan, Clearfield County, for the period January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2024, in accordance with the criteria described in the Background section of this report and the Department of Transportation's Publication 9.

In accordance with Government Auditing Standards, we are required to report all deficiencies that are considered to be significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in internal control; fraud and noncompliance with provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, or grant agreements that have a material effect on the Forms MS-965; and any other instances that warrant the attention of those charged with governance. We are also required to obtain and report the views of responsible officials concerning the findings, conclusions, and recommendations, as well as any planned corrective actions. We performed our examination to express an opinion on whether the Forms MS-965 are presented in accordance with the criteria described above and not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on internal control over the Forms MS-965 or on compliance and other matters; accordingly, we express no such opinions. The results of our tests did not disclose any matters that are required to be reported under Government Auditing Standards. However, we did note a matter that, while not required to be included in this report by Government Auditing *Standards*, has been included in the finding below:

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Background

The Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law¹ provides municipalities other than counties (i.e., townships, boroughs, cities, towns, home rule, and optional plan governments) with an annual allocation of liquid fuels taxes from the state's Motor License Fund to be used for the maintenance and repair of streets, roads, and bridges for which the municipality is responsible. The allocation of these funds to municipalities is based upon: (1) 50 percent on the municipality's proportion of local road mileage to the total local road mileage maintained by all political subdivisions making application in the county; and (2) 50 percent on the proportion of a municipality's population to the total population of all municipalities making application in the state.²

Section 9511 (relating to Allocation of proceeds) of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code provides municipalities with annual maintenance payments to be received from the Motor License Fund.³

Each municipality must deposit the allocation of Liquid Fuels Tax funds and annual maintenance payments that it receives into a special fund called either the Municipal Liquid Fuels Tax Fund or State Fund. A municipality may not deposit any other monies into this fund except when the municipality does not have enough money in the special fund to meet the payments called for by its current annual budget for road and bridge purposes. In such a case, the municipality may borrow money or transfer money from its General Fund to its Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

The Department of Transportation has been given the regulatory authority for the administration of these funds. Department of Transportation's *Publication 9* includes the policies and procedures for the administration of Act 655, as amended, and the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money. However, if there is a difference between *Publication 9* and any legislation, the legislation shall govern.

To qualify for the annual allocation of Liquid Fuels Tax funds, *Publication 9* indicates that each municipality shall:

1. Submit annual reports (MS-965, Actual Use Report, MS-965P, Project and Miscellaneous Receipts, and MS-965S, Record of Checks).

- 2. Make deposits and payments or expenditures in compliance with Act 655, as amended. Failure to do so may result in not receiving allocations from PennDOT until all discrepancies are resolved. *Publication 9*, Section 2.6, includes information about investing Liquid Fuels Tax monies, using loan or bond proceeds, and types of receipts that can be placed into the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.
- 3. Submit the Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development's (DCED) Report of Elected and Appointed Officials by January 31st and the Survey of Financial Condition By March 15th.
- 4. Ensure resolution of all Contractor Responsibility Program (CRP) holds and blocks imposed by the Department of Revenue and the Department of Labor and Industry.
- 5. Ensure resolution of all reimbursements required as a result of audits performed by the Department of the Auditor General or monitoring reviews performed by the Department of Transportation's Financial Consultants.

Criteria

The criteria for the Form MS-965 With Adjustment are described below.

Section 1 of Form MS-965 With Adjustments provides a summary of Liquid Fuels Tax Fund expenditures by category. Categories requiring explanation include:

Background (Continued)

Section 2 of Form MS-965 With Adjustments provides information on the fund balance. Categories requiring explanation include:

- The state allocation is available from the Department of Transportation in March of each year. The amount the municipality receives is based half on its population and half on its road mileage.
- Municipalities that transferred roads from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to the municipality through the Highway Transfer Program receive annual turnback allocations in March of each year from the Department of Transportation. Turnback allocations are based on the mileage of the roads transferred.
- Expenditures include the total transferred from Section 1.

Section 3 of Form MS-965 With Adjustments determines if the municipality expended Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money in excess of the permissible amount for equipment and the balance that the municipality may carry forward for the purchase of equipment to the subsequent year.

Department of Transportation *Publication 9* requires that the amount expended for equipment purchases in a given year not exceed the sum of the equipment balance carried forward from the previous year and 20 percent of the current year's Liquid Fuels Tax Fund allocation and, if applicable, 20 percent of the turnback allocation plus other Department of Transportation approved adjustments.

If the municipality spent in excess of the amount listed on Line 4, the excess must be reimbursed to the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

The equipment balance to be carried forward for the subsequent year is the lesser of the amount on Line 6 or the ending fund balance on Line 6 of Section 2, but not less than zero.

Background (Continued)

Basis of Presentation

The financial activities of the municipality are accounted for in separate funds. The Liquid Fuels Tax Fund is used to account for state aid revenues from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation used primarily for building and improving local roads and bridges. The Form MS-965 has been prepared in accordance with reporting requirements prescribed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation as a result of the Fuels Tax Act 655, as amended, which does not constitute a complete presentation of the entity's assets, liabilities, expenses, and fund balance. Accordingly, the presentation of Form MS-965 With Adjustments is restricted to the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund, which represents a segment of the entity's financial activities.

Basis Of Accounting

The accompanying Forms MS-965 With Adjustments is prepared in accordance with reporting requirements prescribed by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. Under this method, revenues are recognized when received and expenditures are recorded when paid.

General Fixed Assets

General fixed assets are recognized as expenditures at the time of purchase. No depreciation has been provided on the heavy equipment used to maintain and repair roads and bridges.

Payments In Error

On September 6, 2022, and September 15, 2022, the municipality expended \$552.97 for an employee's wages and \$126.00 for mileage reimbursement, respectively, in error. On September 26, 2022, the municipality transferred \$678.97 from its General Fund to its Liquid Fuels Tax Fund to correct the payments in error.

Lease-Purchase Agreement

On October 7, 2015, the municipality entered into a lease-purchase agreement with Caterpillar Financial to purchase a new 2015 CAT loader for \$133,978.00. The agreement was for a term of seven years at an interest rate of 2.75 percent. Principal and interest payments of \$1,290.87 are due monthly with a final payment of \$44,250.87 due on October 22, 2022. Prior years' principal and interest payments from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund were \$53,444.16 and \$12,390.21, respectively.

During our current examination period, the municipality paid principal of \$36,566.74 and interest of \$4,741.00 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. These amounts are reflected in major equipment purchases on the 2020, 2021, and 2022 Forms MS-965 - Section 1. The remaining principal balance of \$43,967.10 plus interest of \$283.77, for a total of \$44,250.87, was paid off with the proceeds from a new consolidated loan on October 8, 2022.

Bank Loan

On May 29, 2018, the municipality purchased a 2008 John Deere grader model 772D for \$107,000.00. The municipality made a down payment of \$15,000.00 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. The municipality borrowed the remaining \$92,000.00, plus fees of \$824.36, for a total of \$92,824.36 from Northwest Bank. The term of the loan was for ten years at an interest rate of 6.05 percent. Principal and interest payments of \$1,037.14 are due monthly. Prior years' principal and interest payments from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund were \$11,180.09 and \$8,525.57, respectively.

During the current examination period, the municipality paid principal of \$22,213.48 and interest of \$12,012.14 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. These amounts are reflected in major equipment purchases on the 2020, 2021, and 2022 Forms MS-965 - Section 1. The remaining principal balance of \$59,430.79 plus interest of \$140.39, for a total of \$59,571.18, was paid off with the proceeds from a new consolidated loan on October 8, 2022.

Bank Loan

On October 8, 2022, the municipality consolidated their CAT loader lease-purchase agreement with a balance of \$44,250.87 and their John Deere loan with a balance of \$59,571.18 into one loan with Northwest Bank. After a refund of \$1,992.00 and loan fees of \$1,551.95, the amount of the bank loan was \$107,366.00. The term of the loan was for ten years at an interest rate of 6.00 percent. Principal and interest payments of \$1,196.73 are due monthly.

During the current examination period, the municipality paid principal of \$18,090.76, interest of \$13,024.22, and fees of \$106.61 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. These amounts are reflected in major equipment purchases on the 2022, 2023 and 2024 Forms MS-965 - Section 1. The outstanding balance of the bank loan as of December 31, 2024, was \$89,275.24 plus interest.

Bank Loan

On February 20, 2024, the municipality purchased a 2021 Ford F550 truck for \$66,183.14. The municipality made a down payment of \$36,183.14 from the from the General Fund. The municipality borrowed the remaining \$30,000.00 from Northwest Bank. The term of the loan was for seven years at an interest rate of 7.88 percent. Principal and interest payments of \$467.43 are due monthly.

During the current examination period the municipality paid principal of \$30,000.00, interest of \$1,260.89, and loan fees of \$283.63 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund. These amounts are reflected in major equipment purchases on the 2024 Form MS-965 - Section 1. The loan was paid in full on September 4, 2024.

Finding - Non-permissible Expenditure

We tested 78 expenditures totaling \$216,944.19 and found that the municipality made one expenditure totaling \$3,594.50 during 2022 from the Liquid Fuels Tax Fund for non-state approved dust control, which is a non-permissible expenditure.

The Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law, 72 P.S. § 2615.4, provides, in part, that monies herein allocated may be used only for construction, reconstruction, maintenance, and repairs of such public roads or streets, including bridges, culverts and drainage structures, for which they are legally responsible. Also permitted are expenditures involving acquisition, maintenance, repairs and operation of street signs, traffic signs, traffic signal control systems, road equipment, and snow fences.

The Department of Transportation has been statutorily authorized to promulgate regulations concerning the administration of Liquid Fuels Tax Fund money and has determined that certain items, including non-state approved dust control, are outside the scope of permissible expenditures.

The failure to follow the Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law and the Department of Transportation's Regulations as noted above could result in the municipality having to reimburse \$3,594.50 to its Liquid Fuels Tax Fund.

The condition occurred because the municipality did not know that the dust control was not state approved.

Recommendations

We recommend that the municipality reimburse \$3,594.50 to its Liquid Fuels Tax Fund upon official notification by the Department of Transportation.

We further recommend that the municipality comply with the Liquid Fuels Tax Municipal Allocation Law and the Department of Transportation's Regulations regarding permissible expenditures.

Management's Response

The secretary/treasurer offered no formal response at this time.
